**PBS**

PBS HD is a 24-hour source for high-def programs available through the Public Broadcasting Service's digital TV stations nationwide. The channel shows the high-def version of a program (if available) at the same time as the standard-def version debuts on PBS's analog stations. Premieres this fall include *Broadway: The American Musical* (below — see "S&V Picks," page 140), presented in six episodes from Oct. 19 to



21; *Great Performances: Carnegie Hall Opening Night 2004* on Oct. 27, featuring Yo-Yo Ma and Renée Fleming; and, in 5.1-channel sound, *Great Performances: Eric Clapton's Crossroads Guitar Festival* on Dec. 1.

But these simulcasts are rare. Typically, you'll see such venerable series as *Nova*, *Innovation*, *Nature*, *Masterpiece Theatre*, *Soundstage*, and *American Family*.

**SPORTS**

ABC presents *Monday Night Football* in high-def, including the Miami Dolphins vs. New York Jets on Nov. 1 and St. Louis Rams vs. Green Bay Packers on Nov. 29. CBS carries pro football, college basketball, and major golf tournaments.



NBC Sports will carry horse racing's Triple Crown next spring. New to HDTV this fall is Fox, which will show Super Bowl XXXIX in February in HDTV. Fox is also likely to feature MLB playoffs, the World Series, NFL games, and Nascar races in high-def.

**MOVIES**

You don't have to pay for cable or satellite to see movies in high-def. The commercial networks are showing plenty of flicks in HDTV this fall, simulcasting them with the analog versions. And sometimes — most often on ABC — they're shown with Dolby Digital 5.1-channel surround sound.

CBS offers movies on Sunday nights, NBC sometimes on Saturdays, and ABC on Saturdays and, once football ends, Mondays. CBS, for instance, will show *The Bourne Identity*, *I Am Sam*, *How to Lose a Guy in 10 Days*, *The Scorpion King*, *Ocean's Eleven*, and *John Q* in 2004–2005, while the WB is showing *The Lord of the*



*Rings: The Fellowship of the Ring* in November. NBC will show *Shrek* (below) as a special on Nov. 28, the Sunday night of Thanksgiving weekend. Neither NBC nor ABC had released its scheduled movies past September as we went to press. UPN and Fox don't have a weekly movie.

As for original miniseries and made-for-TV movies, CBS will show *Elvis*, *The Dead Will Tell*, *Suburban Madness*, *Perfect Strangers*, and *The Culpepper Cattle Company* as well as two holiday movies: *A Christmas Without Ornaments* and *Say When*. The WB is offering a remake of *The Blue Lagoon* in November and *Samantha: An American Girl Holiday* in December.
